SPECIAL GUEST SPEAKER ELIZABETH KOLBERT



Elizabeth Kolbert is a Pulitzer Prize winning author of *The Sixth Extinction: An Unnatural History*, which discusses mass extinctions by weaving intellectual and natural history with reporting in the field. She has traveled from Alaska to Greenland, and visited top scientists to get to the heart of the debate over global warming. Her newest book, *Under a White Sky: The Nature of the Future*, was released by Random House on February 9, 2021.

Elizabeth Kolbert has been a staff writer for The New Yorker since 1999 and has written dozens of pieces for the magazine. Her series on global warming, "The Climate of Man." won the American Association for the Advancement of Science's magazine award in 2005. Ms. Kolbert has won numerous awards, including the National Academy of Sciences Communication Award in the newspaper/magazine category, a Lannan Writing Fellowship, and the prestigious Heinz Award which recognizes individuals who are addressing global change caused by the impact of human activities and natural processes on the environment. She also was named the 12th Janet Weis Fellow in Contemporary Letters at Bucknell University, was the recipient of the 2016 Sam Rose '58 and Julie Walters Prize at Dickinson College for Global Environmental and was the recipient of the Pell Center Prize for Story in the Public Square.

Growing out of a groundbreaking three-part series in The New Yorker, Field Notes from a Catastrophe: Man, Nature, and Climate Change brings the environment into the consciousness of the American people and asks what, if anything, can be done, and how we can save our planet. She explains the science and the studies, draws frightening parallels to lost ancient civilizations, unpacks the politics, and presents the personal tales of those who are being affected most—the people who make their homes near the poles and. in eerie an foreshadowing, are watching their worlds disappear. Field Notes from a Catastrophe: Man, Nature, and Climate Change was chosen as one of the 100 Notable Books of the Year (2006) by The New York Times Book Review.
