Northern Checkerspot (*Chlosyne palla*)

• Above, **bands of yellow and creamy orange** with median band often paler; **dark brown basal area on hindwing**. Distinctive below with **reddish orange color** and **creamy or pale yellow** (not white) **basal spots**, median band and marginal crescents. Females variable, from orange with black markings to mostly black with creamy bands.

- Wingspan: Medium; 1 3/8 to 1 7/8 inches.
- <u>Habitat:</u> Openings in aspen woodlands, meadows, streamsides, and clearings; foothills, montane.
- Flight Times: April to mid-August; one brood.

- <u>Larval Foodplant</u>: Rabbitbrush, goldenrods, fleabane daisies, and other asters.

Arachne Checkerspot (*Polydryas arachne*)

• Above, brownish orange with black markings and sometimes a lighter median band. Below, orange with white bands, the white median band has rows with black spots. The abdomen is black with orange bands. The eyes are blue-gray.

- Wingspan: Small; 1 1/8 to 1 1/2 inches.
- Habitat: Grasslands and mountain meadows; foothills, montane.
- <u>Flight Times:</u> May to September; one to two broods. Third-stage caterpillars hibernate.
- Larval Foodplant: Beardstongue (Penstemons) in the Figwort family.

Variable Checkerspot (*Euphydryas anicia*)

• Above, essentially black with red, orange and/or white spots; eyes brown, usually with luminous antenna clubs. Abdomen usually with white dots. Below, the hindwing has 3 bands of cream or white separated by orange bands.

- Wingspan: Small; 1 1/4 to 2 1/4 inches.
- <u>Habitat:</u> Many open habitats from stream courses to sagebrush hills, canyons and alpine tundra; foothills, montane, alpine.
- <u>Flight Times:</u> May to July; one brood.
- Larval Foodplant: Indian paintbrush, penstemons and snowberry.

Rockslide Checkerspot (*Chlosyne whitneyi*)

• Above, **pale brown-orange with black markings**, variable; female may be darker. Below, **hindwing creamy white** with a **narrow light orange marginal band** and **alternating orange and white spot bands** to base of hindwing which has **orange and white spots**.

- Wingspan: Small; 1 1/4 to 1 1/2 inches.
- Habitat: Alpine scree and rockslides at or above treeline; alpine.
- Flight times: Late June to August; one brood.
- Larval Foodplant: Alpine plants of sunflower family.

Edith's Checkerspot (*Euphydryas editha*)

• Front wing **rounded at tip**. Upperside is **black with red and pale yellow or white bands**. Submarginal band of small yellow or white spots; wide postmedian band is red. Underside of hindwing with alternating bands of yellow-orange and cream.

• <u>Wing Span:</u> 1 1/4 - 2 inches (3.2 - 5.1 cm).

• <u>Habitat</u>: From sea level to treeline through diverse habitats including coastal chaparral, meadows, fields, foothills, open woods, alpine fellfields.

• <u>Flight times:</u> One brood; from March-May at low elevations, June-August at high elevations and in the north.

• <u>Larval Foodplant:</u> Various species of paintbrush, beardtongues, lousewort, owl's clover, Chinese houses, plantain.

Dotted Checkerspot (*Poladryas minuta*)

• Upperside **bright red-orange** with submarginal band of **small crescents**. Underside orange. Hindwing outer margin with **row of white spots** and then **a row of white crescents bordered with black**. White median band has **thin black line or 2 rows of black spots**.

- <u>Wing Span:</u> 1 1/4 1 7/8 inches
- Habitat: Foothill ridges, grasslands, open mountain meadows.
- Flight: Several flights from January-September.
- <u>Larval Foodplant</u>: Various beardtongues (Penstemon species) in the figwort family

Gorgone Checkerspot (*Chlosyne gorgone*)

• Upperside is **orange with black markings**; hindwing with submarginal row of **solid black spots**. Underside of hindwing has a **zigzag pattern of brown and white bands** and a **median band of white chevrons**.

• <u>Wing Span:</u> 1 1/4 - 1 3/4 inches

• <u>Habitat:</u> Open areas including ridges, prairies, streamsides, open hardwood forests, old fields, forest edges.

• <u>Flight:</u> One brood in the north from July-August, two broods in the central part of the range from May-September.

• <u>Caterpillar Hosts:</u> Several plants in the Asteraceae including sunflower and crosswort species.

Leanira Checkerspot (*Chlosyne leanira*)

• Upperside ranges from **black to orange**, with **light spots**. Underside of hindwing is **cream-colored with black veins**; **wide black median band** surrounds **cream-colored spots**.

- <u>Wing Span:</u> 1 3/8 1 3/4 inches (3.5 4.5 cm).
- <u>Habitat:</u> Open prairies, canyons, desert hills, foothills, washes, roadcuts.
- <u>Flight:</u> One flight from April-July.
- <u>Caterpillar Hosts:</u> Paintbrush (Castilleja species).
