

## Plants for pollinators (not deer or rabbits)

There is no such thing as deer proof or rabbit proof in the garden - if these plant-eaters are hungry enough, they will try almost anything. However, by choosing less palatable plants and making the habitat less welcoming, you can give your pollinator garden a chance to grow.

- Sturdy fencing and barriers are the most reliable method of exclusion.
- Repellants vary in effectiveness depending on species, location and time of year –
  what worked once may not work again, or what worked for one garden may not work
  for another. Use a variety of repellants so that these mammals don't grow
  accustomed.
- Emphasize unpalatable plants such as these listed below. Big plants can withstand grazing better consider caging while establishing a new plant so it can reach a more resilient size.
