# Butterfly Pavilion and City of Westminster Forge Transformational Agreement to Keep Butterfly Pavilion in Westminster

Partnership launches a shared vision to build a state-of-the-art campus for invertebrate research, conservation, education, and immersive guest experiences.

Westminster, Colo., [September 8, 2025] – Today, Butterfly Pavilion and the City of Westminster proudly announce a signed Letter of Intent to keep Butterfly Pavilion in Westminster and begin a phased renovation and expansion. The goal is to grow Butterfly Pavilion into a world-class destination that welcomes more visitors from around the world and strengthens Colorado's economy, while deepening its impact in the community and beyond.

"This partnership is a bold step toward the future," said Mark Corbett, Board Chair, Butterfly Pavilion. "It's about creating something visionary, not just for Butterfly Pavilion, but for Westminster and the entire region. Together, we're laying the groundwork for a dynamic campus that will spark innovation, inspire environmental leadership, and serve as a model for how cities and cultural institutions can shape a better, more sustainable world."

This early-stage public-private partnership outlines a shared vision to improve Butterfly Pavilion's current site at 104th Avenue and establish Westminster as a global hub for invertebrate research, conservation, education, and nature-based experiences, rooted in the urgent mission to protect and conserve invertebrates, animals without backbones that are the foundation of life on Earth.

"This partnership is a testament to the City of Westminster's vision and unwavering support," said Ryan Welch, President and CEO of Butterfly Pavilion. "Together, we're not just building a new campus – we're investing in curiosity, conservation, and community. It's a heartfelt affirmation of what we can achieve when civic leaders and mission-driven organizations unite for the greater good."

"Butterfly Pavilion has been part of the fabric of our community for three decades," said Westminster Mayor Nancy McNally. "This new chapter ensures that families who live, work, and play in Westminster will continue to have access to one of the most unique, inspiring places in the country, right in their own backyard. We're proud to support a project that enriches lives, strengthens our city, and connects people of all ages to the natural world."

### A Partnership with Purpose

Planning is already underway to develop a long-term strategy that sets the stage for growth,

funding opportunities, and a shared vision to build a renowned institution that serves the community and advances efforts to protect and conserve invertebrates and their habitats.

Invertebrates make up 97% of all animal species on Earth and are essential to healthy ecosystems. They pollinate crops, recycle nutrients, support soil and water systems, and sustain life across the planet. Despite their importance, invertebrates are often overlooked and increasingly at risk. This expansion makes it possible to raise awareness and protect these vital creatures at a time when the planet needs it most.

"With thoughtful planning and deep community support, the expanded Butterfly Pavilion will stand as a place where science meets storytelling, conservation becomes action, and small wonders lead to big change," said Welch.
